St Hilary South

St Hilary – Llanblethian – Llandough – St Mary Church – Flemingston – Llanbethery – Treguff – St Hilary

11 miles-18km / 4½-5½ hours / 1,100 feet ascent

Lots of stiles and gates

Mainly field paths and tracks, some country lanes towards the end

Overview

This is the longest walk in the series and, although St Hilary is the highest point of the walk, there is over 1,000 feet of ascent.

There are three distinct sections. Tracks and woodland to Llanblethian, then fields and little used paths and roads to Flemingston, across Flemingston Moor to Llanbethery and finally a quiet country lane back to the village.

There's no pub along the route, so the Bush is the place to aim for!

Directions: part 1 – St Hilary to St Mary Church (7km)

- 1. Facing the main entrance of the Bush, turn to the left, round the corner to the right and down the lane
- 2. At the derestricted speed sign after 200m, ignore the "No Through Road" sign only applies to vehicles
- 3. At the "Private Road" sign after a further 400m, take the track to the right up into the woods (opposite the Coach House drive on the left) and then left through the woods parallel with the lane
- 4. The path drops down to a stile, turn left into the field then through a gate and right onto the farm track
- 5. At the end of the track (1.2 km) cross the main road take care and through the gate and onto a track leading to the waterworks (don't go over the home made stile on the right) just before the waterworks go right though a double gate then follow the stream on the left to a footbridge in 400m
- 6. Cross the footbridge and turn right and continue with the stream on the right over three stiles and eventually through a (sometimes muddy) paddock and then turn left onto the road
- 7. After 100m take the enclosed path to the left after the 2nd house
- 8. Over a concrete stile then diagonally right to a stile, then go straight up the field keeping hedge on the left, then over a stile
- 9. Cross a farm track through two gates, keep the hedge on right, then over a stile
- 10. Straight downhill through the field, then bear slightly to the left and cross the drive through two small gates into a field, keeping to the trees on the left
- 11.20m before the corner of the field go left over stile through a small copse, then over stile in the right corner
- 12.After 20m take a clear zig zag path to right, then right down a drive at the lane turn left, and after a further 25m follow the lane right and downhill

 If you continue straight on you can visit Llandough Church (St Dochdwy)
- 13.At the T junction at the bottom of the hill turn very sharp right, over the river and follow the lane up the hill
- 14. Just before the crest of the road go over a stile to left in a high bank head for St Mary Church on the horizon over several stiles
- 15. Follow a straight line over stiles until dropping down by the right of a small farm / builders yard, cross a footbridge, over a stile in the corner then cross the main road diagonally right (take great care)
- 16.Over a stile on the left, up a steep bank and over a stile, turn left onto farm track, then right before a house, head for the stile in the apex of the wood opposite, follow the path uphill in the wood, over a stile, up a steep hill to the next stile eventually coming out in St Mary Church

Directions: part 2 – St Mary Church to St Hilary (11km)

- 17. Turn left onto lane in St Mary Church (keep the church on your right), at the bend take the left fork following the lane out of the village, eventually turning left onto the main road this is a fast busy road, take great care
- 18. After c400m, take the stile on the right, head diagonally across the field, cross the track and the stile
- 19. Over a stile, then aim for left of the farmhouse (Fishweir), right at the corner, through the farmyard taking the path after the 2nd outbuilding (do not take the track between the two buildings) follow the path emerging on a country lane turn right for Flemingston
- 20. At the junction in Flemingston, bear left following the perimeter of the village and then the lane out of the village
- 21. As the lane reaches the brow, take the clear open track on the left
- 22. Over stile after 400m, then a further 300m to a stile by the left hand gate (of three gates) and follow the path down to the bottom of the valley (Flemingston Moors)
- 23. Cross the river by the concrete bridge and take the track to the right which becomes the lane uphill into Llanbethery
- 24. Walk through Llanbethery just after the last house on the left take the stile on the left and cross the field diagonally to the right (If this field is overgrown, continue along the lane and then turn left and left again to reach the lane on the left to St Hilary)
- 25. Over the stile at the far side of the field, turn left and then immediately left again following the lane downhill to Treguff
- 26. After 2.5km cross the road take care and follow the switchback lane for a further 2.2km back to St Hilary
